Responsibilities

The Animal Control Sub-Committee is responsible for the following activities:

- 1. To review annually in January/February fees in relation to registration and impounding
- 2. To review, present, prepare and meet the requirements under section 10A of the Dog Control Act 1996.
- 3. To monitor the following Dog Parks:
 - a) Renwick fox's island completed
 - b) Blenheim planning and Construction process
 - c) Remembrance Area ongoing
 - d) Picton Parks Future endeavour
- 4. To interact with the community on matters regarding:
 - a) Dog Control related ratepayer issues and concerns
 - b) SPCA
 - c) Marlborough 4 Paws
 - d) Local Vet Centres
- 5. To consult on the Dog Control Bylaw and related policies every 10 years.

All powers for the Animal Control Sub-Committee are appointed under s 41A(3)(b) & (c) of the Local Government Act 2002.

- 1. All powers necessary to perform the committee's responsibilities, including:
 - a) approval of a submission to an external body
 - b) establishment of working parties or steering groups.
- 6. **Associated decision**: If a matter relates primarily to the responsibilities of the Animal Control Sub-Committee, but aspects require additional decisions by the Environment and Planning Committee, then the Animal Control Sub- Committee has the powers to make associated decisions on behalf of the Environment and Planning Committee. For the avoidance of doubt, this means that matters do not need to be taken to more than one of these committees for decisions.
- 7. **Referral of decisions**: The Sub-Committee may, from time to time, refer matters which it would ordinarily consider, to another Committee, if it considers the matter/project would be better dealt with by that other Committee.
- 8. **Referral for urgency**: The Sub-Committee Chair is authorised to refer urgent matters to the Council for decision, where this Committee would ordinarily have considered the matter.

Delegation Limits (if any)

The committee does not have:

- 1. the power to establish subcommittees; and
- 2. powers that the Council cannot delegate or has retained to itself.

Procedure

The Chairperson will report back to the Environment and Planning Committee with recommendations of the Animal Control Committee at the next Environment and Planning Committee meeting following each Sub-Committee meeting.

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
