## **Biosecurity**

Reporting period: 04/04/2024 - 26/04/2024

## **Broom and Gorse**

(E315-003-016, E315-003-005)

Broom and Gorse compliance inspections have been carried out across the upper Wairau Valley, Ure Valley and Awatere Valley containment areas. Majority of landowners and occupiers have completed their control work to high standards. The two issues identified in the upper Wairau containment zone have been worked through with the land occupiers.

Bur daisy (E315-003-007-01)

Biosecurity staff completed their second round of surveillance for Bur daisy at Summerlands Farm in early May. A total of 11.5 hours was spent searching, with no plants found.

#### Mediterranean fanworm

(E315-003-009)

A total of six Mediterranean fanworm have been found in the Waikawa area since the response began in early March. More work is planned to be undertaken in the new financial year.

A joint training exercise was undertaken with the Top of the South Councils. The Biosecurity officers from the three councils deployed the Fabdock, a large inflatable that can be used to encapsulate a vessel that contains marine pests.

## Moth plant

(E315-003-020-01)

In April, biosecurity officers responded to two reports of moth plant sightings. One was at an already known site on Muller Road where one vine was removed. The other was a new site at Redwoodtown School where a large plant was destroyed and approximately 50 pods removed.

During this period, Biosecurity staff also collected samples of moth plant from three separate sites as requested by Manaaki Whenua Landcare Research (MWLR). This was to assist MWLR with a project they are undertaking to conduct molecular analyses on moth plant from throughout the New Zealand distribution range.

## Nassella tussock

(E315-003-021-01)

This year's nassella monitoring programme was carried out during April and May. The purpose of the programme is to determine long-term nassella density trends for Marlborough. This is the seventh year the monitoring work has been undertaken with 26 properties being randomly selected to be included in this year's survey.

A total of 114 transect lines were walked with 158.5 hours committed. The overall estimated density this year came out at 37.1 plants per hectare. The graph below shows the last seven years of data.

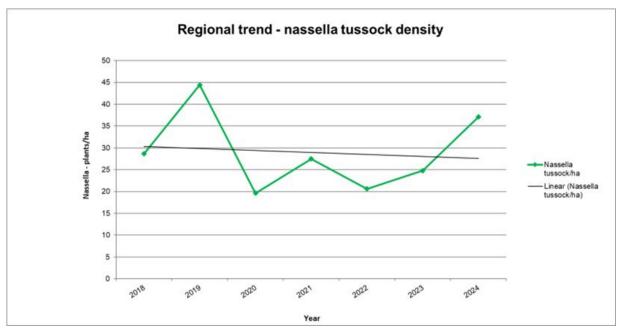


Figure 3: Nassella tussock density trend over the last seven years

## **Parrots feather**

(E315-003-022-01)

Additional control work was carried out on a parrots feather site on Ruakanakana Creek that had already been visited earlier in the year. Five litres of herbicide were used to treat areas of regrowth.

## **Purple loosestrife**

(E315-003-024-01)

The last remaining active purple loosestrife site was visited in early May, with a total of 5 plants destroyed.

## **Pest conifers**

(E315-003-023-01)

#### **National Wilding Conifer Control 2023/2024 Programme update:**

**Waihopai:** The South Marlborough Landscape Restoration Trust (SMLRT) has completed its first year in the programme management role.

The Trust's 2023/2024 operations have been carried out in the Waihopai management unit. Gains have been made in the Wye Hills area where an additional \$30K of funding was provided by DOC in June, enabling the initial control work to be completed. Initial control in the Ferny Gair operational area has also been completed around >95% of coning age contorta being controlled. Ferny Gair will not be subject to the 2024/2025 work plan due to limited funds.

**Molesworth:** Molesworth programme manager Boffa Miskell are close to completing the aerial wanding and ground control throughout the Molesworth area.

Boffa Miskell, MPI and MDC recently undertook a survey flight as part of their 2024/2025 operational planning. The survey was a good opportunity to see the good progress being made since 2018, at a time when some areas in the Tarndale area were covered by a 60%-90% *Pinus contorta* canopy.

**Sounds:** The Marlborough Sounds Restoration Trust (SMRT) have completed all funded projects for 2023/2024. A draft operational Plan for 2024/2025 has been submitted for feedback.

## Programme planning 2024/2025

The proposed operational plans for 2024/2025 have been completed and submitted to MPI for review and approval.

With limited funds available for the 2024/2025 season the objective is to maintain the gains in high spreadrisk areas where initial control work has already been undertaken. Additionally, MU Managers and project managers have also presented a deferred maintenance budget and a budget for any high risk/priority areas where initial control has not been undertaken ('plus' budget). This aims to paint a clearer picture of the actual level of funding required across the Management Units (MUs) to enable work to progress and to help prioritise any additional funding 2024/2025 should it become available.

### **MPI NWCCP Funding Agreement**

MPI has proposed a change to the National Programme's funding structure between it and the regional fund holders. In 2023/2024 and in the years' prior the NWCCP was subject to a funding agreement between MPI and the regional fund holders. From 2024/2025 onwards MPI has proposed to replace these funding agreements with a contract for services. MDC and other regional fund holders are currently working through a process to determine how this will shape the implementation of the programme in 2024/2025.

Rabbits (E315-003-025)

The Rabbit night counts were completed over three nights with eight tracks being completed in the upper Awatere. Over the 91 kilometres of track being inspected 550 rabbits were counted, with majority of Rabbits being located in the Molesworth area.

The Ward night count route has now been abandoned as the land use has changed making the old route impassable.

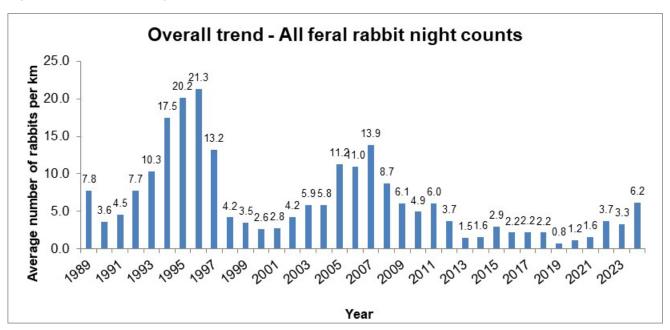


Figure 6: Trend data graph

# Restoring & Protecting Flora Project Concludes (J4N KMTT) (E315-021-002-02, E315-005-030)

#### **Background**

In 2021 a Jobs for Nature funded project known as the Restoring and Protecting Flora Project was stood up in the top of the South Island. The project was facilitated by the Kotahitanga Mo te Taiao alliance (KMTT)

and its partners, including the Marlborough District Council, Nelson City Council, Buller, Tasman District Council, DOC, and Iwi.

The project's purpose was to recruit people into conservation-based work as part of the government's Covid recovery package to boost the regional economy. The project's core focus was to implement short term weed control programmes at high-Value ecological sites across Te tau ihu.

## Marlborough context

In September 2021 the Marlborough District Council signed a contract for services with the project lead The Nature Conservancy (TNC) to enable an Operational Liaison Support role within Council's Biosecurity team to manage the operational delivery of the project. The contract signed in September 2021 expired on 27 May 2024.

Over the last three years the project coordinated with community groups and land occupiers to deliver weed control programmes across nine sites of various tenures which included willow control at the Hinepango wetland at Rarangi, wilding conifer control at Whites Bay Scenic reserve, and at Boons Valley, Waikawa.

The project also greatly assisted MDC with surveillance and early intervention work related to wild kiwifruit vines in the Marlborough Sounds. The work has provided valuable distribution data of this emerging pest plant and will greatly assist in any future considerations to manage the potential impacts of the species as a disease risk to commercial industry, and to biodiversity values in the Marlborough region.

All J4N funded operations have now finished, and the work undertaken has been handed back to land occupiers and community groups to maintain going forward. While MDC's operational support role to the project has also concluded, MDC will assist TNC with any end of project reporting as required.

The map below shows some of the main project sites including a site at Te Whanganui/Port Underwood known for wild kiwifruit infestations.

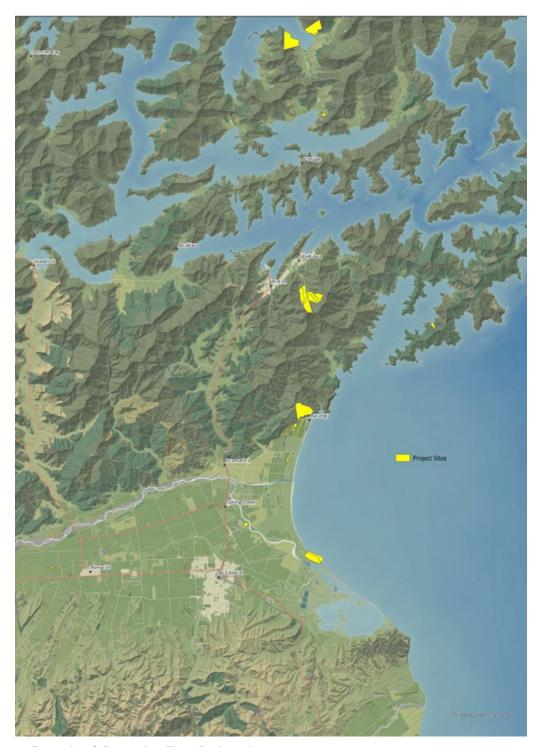


Figure 7: Restoring & Protecting Flora Project sites

## **Woolly nightshade**

(E315-003-036-01)

Last month Biosecurity staff visited the woolly nightshade site at Squally Cove to undertake control work. The main objective was to visit areas where plants had been removed on the previous visit to destroy seedlings and young plants re-emerging.

Four staff members stayed near the site for 5 days to carry out the work. Over the course of the week, approximately 10,000 plants were destroyed.

## White-edged nightshade

Biosecurity staff carried out compliance inspections on all three properties with obligations to destroy whiteedged nightshade. All properties were found to be compliant, with a total of 31 fruiting plants destroyed. Hydrology Update

## Hydrology

## **Hydrology Update Autumn 2024**

(E320-001-001)

Data from the Marlborough District Council's Environmental Monitoring network was primarily used in preparing this report and supplemented with data from the Marlborough Research Centre, MetService, NIWA, and FENZ.

## **Executive Summary**

Autumn was particularly cold this year, with an average temperature of 12.5°C in Blenheim, which is -1.1°C below the long-term average. Ten months out of 11 have recorded below average rainfall in Blenheim, with 286 mm total rainfall from June 2023 to the end of May. This is just 52% of the historic average rainfall for the 11 month period June to May.

Autumn rainfall was 60-70% of the historic average in the upper Wairau Valley, and between 80 and 90% in Blenheim and the surrounding area. Rainfall was unevenly distributed throughout the season, with generally well below average rainfall in March and May, but above average rainfall in April.

March saw a continuation of low flows in rivers across the region, with more water restrictions in place from late March through to early April. This included 15 days of full water restrictions in the Wairau as the Wairau

at Tuamarina site dropped below the 8 m³/s minimum flow. The April rain event resulted in a small flood of 1,200 m³/s in the Wairau River. River flows then declined throughout May, with baseflow declining into the lower quartile in the Awatere, Wairau, Waihopai and Rai rivers by the end of May.

After very low shallow soil moisture throughout March (as measured at the Marlborough Research Centre), it increased to 35% during the rain event in early April and has stayed at or above 30% to the end of May. Compared to average, soils in Marlborough are much drier at the end of autumn this year.

Wairau Aquifer levels are still the lowest on record as measured at the Conders well in late May. The rain event in mid-April raised the groundwater level by 800 mm, however even with this boost the groundwater level was still within the lower quartile. Flows in Spring Creek were somewhat replenished after the rain in mid-April, although still much lower than usual for the time of year. The current record low levels in the Wairau Aquifer are caused by both the long-term declining trend in the aquifer level, and the seasonal effect of the current drought. More frequent rain events will be needed over winter and spring to replenish the aquifer, although this will not address the long-term declining trend. Groundwater levels in the Riverlands Aquifer have risen as water demand has dropped, although the level is within the lower quartile of measurements for the time of year.

Westerly winds are expected over winter, meaning temperatures should be less unusually cold than in autumn. Rainfall is expected to be near or below average in Marlborough through to August. El Niño ended in autumn and ENSO conditions are currently neutral and expected to stay neutral through winter. There is a 60-70% chance that La Niña conditions will develop in spring.

## **Climate**

Autumn 2024 can be described as cold, sunny, and slightly drier than average. May was a particularly cold month, with a mean temperature of 9.4°C at the Marlborough Research Centre, which is -1.9°C below the long-term average. The average temperature for autumn as a whole was 12.5°C, which is -1.1°C below the long-term average. 12 ground frosts were recorded, 1 in April and 11 in May.

Blenheim has received 1,264.5 hours of sunshine from January to May 2024, putting us narrowly ahead of Richmond as the sunniest town in New Zealand so far this year.

#### Rainfall

Blenheim at the Marlborough Research Centre recorded 23.4 mm of rainfall in May, which is 39% of the long-term average. 10 out of 11 months since July 2023 have recorded lower than average rainfall in Blenheim. Total rainfall from July 2023 to May 2024 is 286 mm in Blenheim, which is just 52% of the historic average rainfall for this 11-month period.

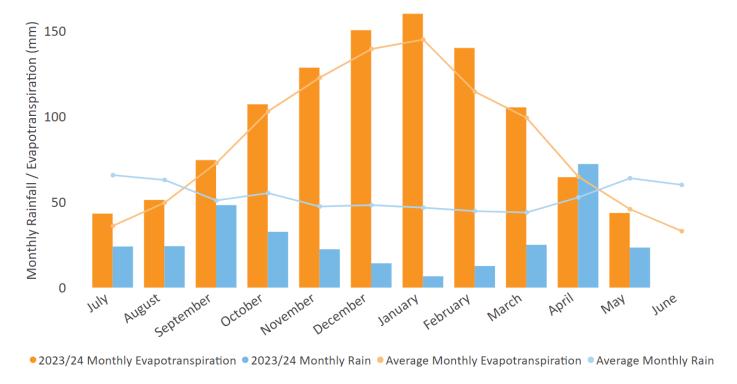


Figure 1. Monthly rainfall and evapotranspiration in Blenheim (Marlborough Research Centre) for the 2023-24 hydrological year, compared to average monthly totals.

In an average year, Blenheim is in water deficit (rainfall is less than evapotranspiration) from September to April. Generally by May rainfall in Blenheim surpasses evapotranspiration, leading to a water surplus (see Figure 1 below). However low rainfall in May 2024 led to a further month of water deficit, with April 2024 the only month to record a water surplus in the 2023/24 hydrological year.

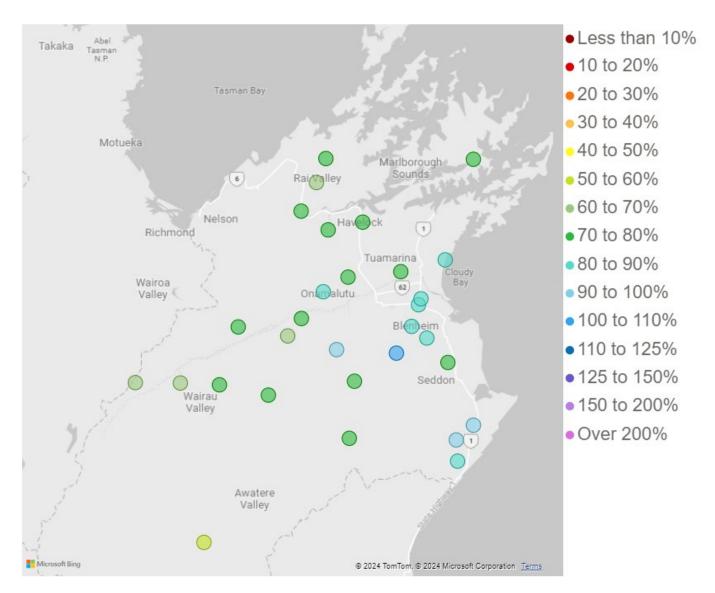


Figure 2. Autumn 2023/24 rainfall at monitoring sites around Marlborough, as a percentage of average autumn rainfall.

Figure 2 shows autumn rainfall for monitoring sites around the region as a percentage of average autumn rainfall. The lowest rainfall when compared to average can be seen in the Molesworth, with 53% of average autumn rainfall, and in the mid to upper Wairau Valley, with 60-70% of average autumn rainfall recorded at several sites. Blenheim and the surrounding area were slightly better off, with 80-90% of average autumn rainfall recorded. On the East Coast, 85-100% of average autumn rainfall was recorded at the three monitoring sites at the Flaxbourne, Ward, and Te Rapa.

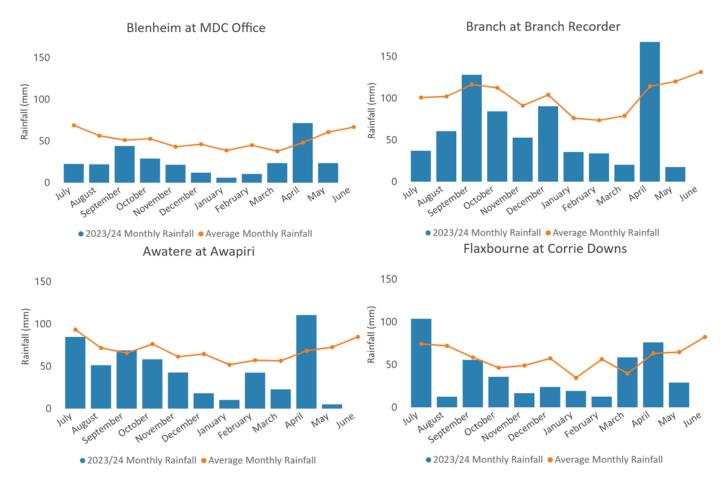


Figure 3. Monthly rainfall totals for the 2023-24 hydrological year from four key sites around Southern Marlborough, compared to average monthly rainfall totals.

Figure 3 shows monthly rainfall from July 2023 onwards at four key sites in Southern Marlborough, compared to monthly averages.

April marked the first month since May 2023 in which Blenheim recorded above average rainfall. 72 mm was recorded, compared to an average of 48 mm. Total rainfall in Blenheim over autumn this year was 120 mm, which is 82% of average autumn rainfall.

March was a dry start to autumn at the Branch at Branch Recorder rainfall site. Just 20 mm of rainfall was recorded, putting the month in the driest 10% of March rainfall totals at the site. This was followed by above average rainfall in April, but again in May the monthly rainfall total of 18 mm was in the 10<sup>th</sup> percentile. Autumn rainfall at the site totalled 205 mm, which is 65% of average autumn rainfall.

A similar rainfall pattern can be seen at Awatere at Awapiri. May recorded just 5 mm of rainfall at the site, which is the lowest May rainfall total since the site was established in 1982.

At the Flaxbourne site, autumn as a whole recorded 98% of average rainfall at the site, although this was not evenly distributed across the 3 months. March and April both had slightly higher than average rainfall, followed by a dry May.

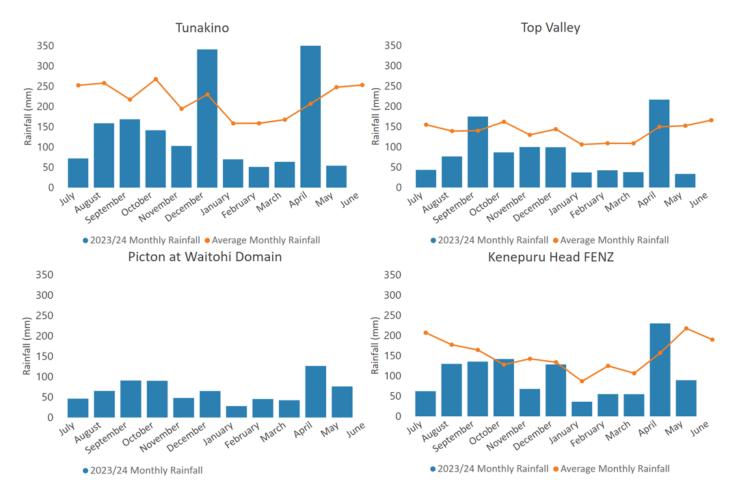


Figure 4. Monthly rainfall totals for the 2023-24 hydrological year from four key sites around Northern Marlborough, compared to average monthly rainfall totals. Note the adjusted scale when compared with the graphs in Figure 3 above.

Figure 4 shows monthly rainfall from July 2023 onwards at four key sites in Northern Marlborough, compared to monthly averages.

Tunakino recorded 251 mm of rainfall in April, well above the long-term monthly average of 207 mm. In contrast March and May both had well below average rainfall, with the 54 mm of rainfall received in May falling into the 10<sup>th</sup> percentile of monthly totals. Total autumn rainfall at Tunakino was 469 mm, around 75% of average autumn rainfall.

At Top Valley, both March and May rainfall totals were in the 10<sup>th</sup> percentile, with above average rainfall in April.

Picton received 244 mm of total rainfall in autumn, of which just over half (126 mm) was recorded in April. As the site has only been in place since 2018, more data needs to be collected before averages can be calculated.

A full list of monthly rainfall totals for the 2023/24 hydrological year at all rainfall monitoring sites can be found in the appendix, Table A1.

#### **River Flows**

At the Awatere at Awapiri flow site average flow for March was 1.9 m³/s, just 25% of the March long-term average flow. Class B water takes were fully restricted for 38 days during March and early April until the rainfall event on April 11-12<sup>th</sup>. Peak flow from this event was close to 100 m³/s at Awapiri, and the mean flow for April was 8.8 m³/s, which is close to average. As previously mentioned, just 5 mm of rain fell at Awapiri in May, so flow declined throughout the month. Average flow in May was 4.4 m³/s, which is 38% of the long-term average flow for May.

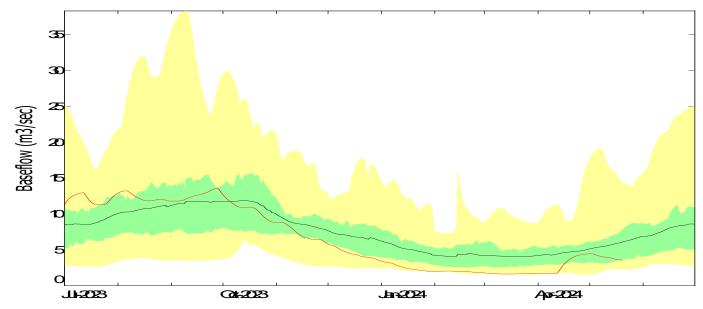


Figure 5. Awatere River at Awapiri baseflow, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average baseflow and the red line is the 2023/24 baseflow. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

Baseflow at Awapiri stayed within the lower quartile for an extended period from late November to early April (see Figure 5 below). Average baseflow in March was 1.7 m³/s, which is the lowest baseflow for March since records began in 1977. Baseflow rose in response to the mid-April rainfall event, before declining to reach the lower quartile again by late May.

Average flow for March was 1.5 m³/s at the Waihopai at Craiglochart site, which is just 19% of the March long-term average. Flow was under the 1.5 m³/s management flow (minimum flow) for 27 days during March and early April, meaning all water permit holders were restricted from taking water. Peak flow from the April rain event was just over 200 m³/s, and subsequently average April flow was near to the long-term average. Flows once again declined in May, with an average flow of 2.7 m³/s, which is 21% of the May long-term average flow.

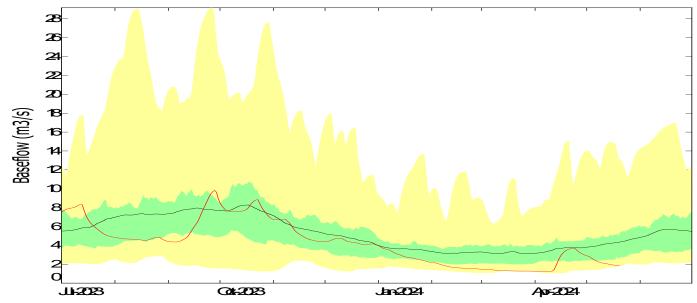


Figure 6. Waihopai River at Craiglochart baseflow, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average baseflow and the red line is the 2023/24 baseflow. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

As can be seen in Figure 6, baseflow at Craiglochart continued to decline while in the lower quartile throughout March. Average March baseflow was 1.3 m³/s, which is equivalent to the minimum March baseflow measured during the notable drought year of 2001. The rain event in mid-April saw baseflow rise to just below average, before declining again into the lower quartile from early May.

Wairau at Tuamarina flow averaged 10 m³/s in March, just 20% of the March long-term average. The mean daily flow dropped below 8 m³/s on 15 days during late March and early April, meaning all water users were restricted on those days. The flood peak on April 12<sup>th</sup> was 1,200 m³/s, which is smaller than the average annual flood which is approximately 1,900 m³/s. Flow declined in May, with an average flow of just under 17 m³/s compared to the long-term average for May of 93 m³/s.

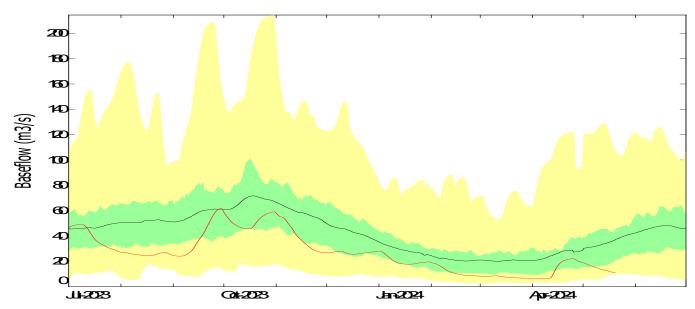


Figure 7. Wairau River at Tuamarina baseflow, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average baseflow and the red line is the 2023/24 baseflow. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

Baseflow continued tracking in the lower quartile through the end of summer and into autumn. A small fresh in mid-April saw baseflow rise slightly, although still below average for the time of year. A very dry May saw baseflow once again recede into the lower quartile early in the month (see Figure 7 below).

Average flow in the Rai was 1.44 m³/s in March, with flow dropping below the 1 m³/s minimum flow at the very end of the month. All water permit holders were restricted from taking water for brief periods around this time. Peak flood flow on the 12<sup>th</sup> of April was 330 m³/s, which is equivalent to an average annual flood. Flows then declined once again into May, with mean flow for the month of just 2.8 m³/s, which is 25% of the May long-term average flow.

Baseflow in the Rai River moved into the lower quartile in autumn. The rain event in mid-April saw baseflow briefly rise to above average, before receding again into the lower quartile in the latter half of May.

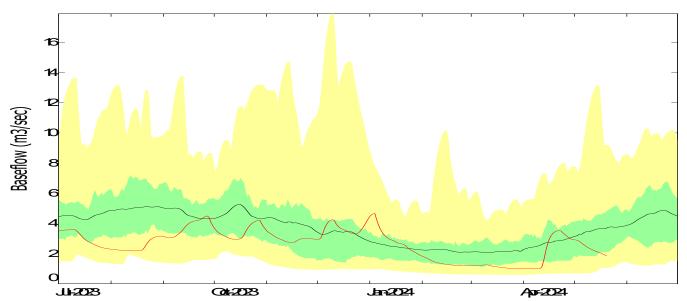


Figure 8. Rai River at Rai Falls baseflow, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average baseflow and the red line is the 2023/24 baseflow. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

## **Soil Moisture**

By the end of March, shallow soil moisture in Blenheim was sitting at just 15.6%. This increased to over 35% on April 12<sup>th</sup> in response to 45 mm of rain the previous day. Shallow soil moisture has stayed near or above 30% since this event, with an additional 20 mm of rain on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May.

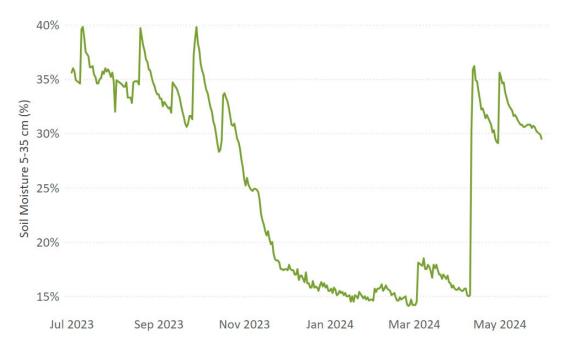


Figure 9. Shallow soil moisture at the Marlborough Research Centre (Blenheim) from the 1st of July 2023 to the 31st of May 2024.

By the end of May, shallow soil moisture had declined to 29.5%, slightly below the long-term average of 31.7%. Figure 9 below shows shallow soil moisture from July 2023 to the end of May.

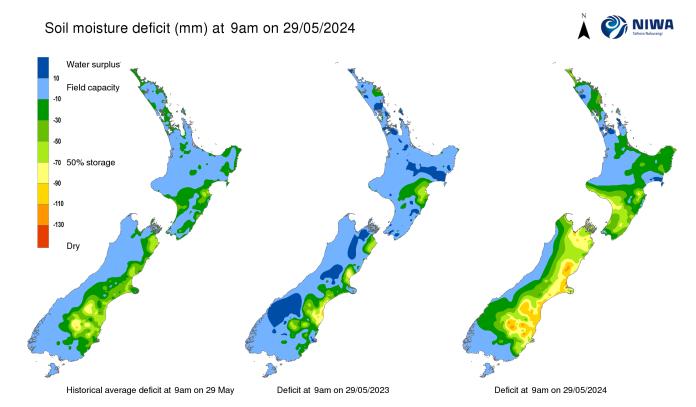


Figure 10. Soil moisture deficit maps of New Zealand, retrieved from NIWA on 29/05/2024.

The soil moisture deficit map from NIWA (right-hand image in Figure 10 below) shows that at the end of May, soils in Marlborough are below field capacity and in large areas soils are still below 50% storage. Compared to the historic average (left-hand image), soils are much drier at the end of autumn this year than usual.

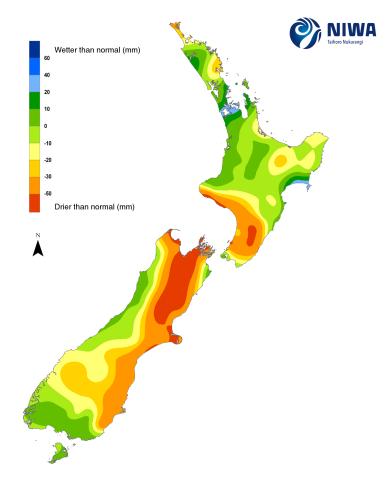


Figure 11. Soil moisture anomaly map of New Zealand, retrieved from NIWA 29/05/2024.

The soil moisture anomaly map (Figure 11) shows how much wetter or drier current soils are currently compared to the historic average. Soils are drier than normal throughout the whole region, with the most extreme difference shown in red, extending down from the Tasman Bay/northern Marlborough Sounds, including the Richmond Ranges, mid and upper Wairau catchment, and the upper Awatere and Molesworth.

## Groundwater

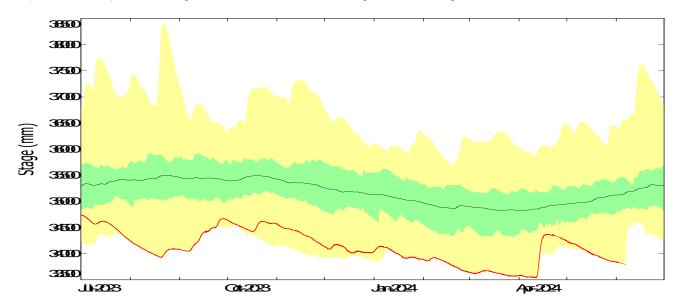


Figure 12. Wairau Aquifer at Conders well water level, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average groundwater level, and the red line is the 2023/24 groundwater level. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

The Wairau Aquifer groundwater level continued to decline throughout March. As can be seen in Figure 12 below, for a period from late July 2023 to late September, and again from early January this year to early April, groundwater levels were the lowest on record at the Conders well since records began in 1973.

The rain event in mid-April raised the water level by 800 mm, however even with this event the water level was still within the lower quartile. With May being yet another dry month, the water level declined, reaching the lowest levels on record again from mid-May.

These record low levels are caused by both the long-term declining trend in the aquifer level, and the seasonal effect of the current drought. More frequent rain events will be needed over winter and spring to replenish the aquifer, although this will not address the long-term declining trend.

The record low water levels in the Wairau Aquifer this year have had an effect on spring flows on the Wairau Plains, for example in Spring Creek. Headwater recession was observed at Spring Creek during the height of the drought, with observed water levels at Spring Creek at Rapaura Tennis Courts lower than during the 2000/01 drought.

Figure 13 below shows Spring Creek at Harvest Restaurant, approximately 400 m downstream of the natural headwaters of Spring Creek. The left-hand image shows the creek on the 28<sup>th</sup> of March 2024, when the streambed was completely dry following on from months of low groundwater levels in the Wairau Aquifer. The right-hand image shows the same location on the 17<sup>th</sup> of April, one week after the April rain event which raised Wairau Aquifer levels by 800 mm at the Conders well. The spring had begun to flow again, although the water level in the channel is still much lower than usual for the time of year.

The Riverlands aquifer has a confined structure, making it highly responsive to both pumping and the loading effect of river flooding in the Wairau and Ōpaoa Rivers.

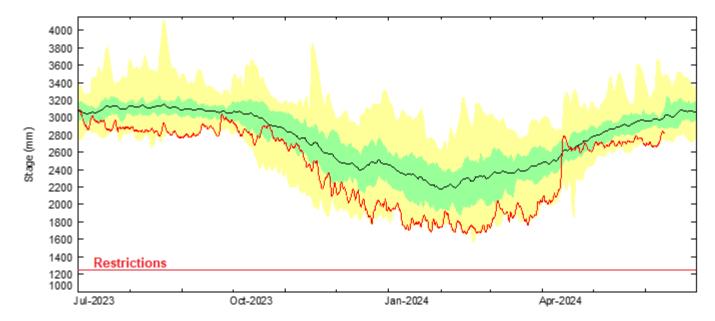


Figure 14. Riverlands Lagoon Well water level, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average groundwater level, and the red line is the 2023/24 groundwater level. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

The summer decline in groundwater level as seen in Figure 14 is in response to water abstraction. Due to the dry conditions this year, demand for irrigation water was high, which led to lower than average groundwater levels throughout the irrigation season.

Groundwater level began to rise at the end of March as water demand decreased. The sharp rise in water level seen in mid-April is in response to flooding in the Wairau River. Flood events do not add water to the aquifer itself (due to the overlying low permeability sediments), instead having a loading effect, essentially 'squeezing' the aquifer and increasing water level. The April flood coincided with a decrease in pumping demand, meaning the higher water levels seen from mid-April onwards are due to both the short term effect of the flood loading effect, and the decrease in pumping.

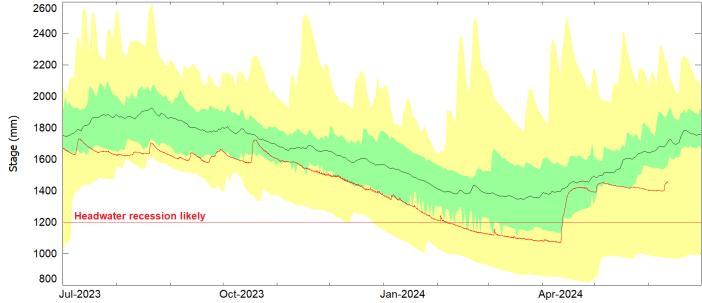


Figure 15. Rarangi Shallow Aquifer at Pipitea Wetland well 4331 water level, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average groundwater level, and the red line is the 2023/24 groundwater level. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartiles.

The Rarangi Shallow Aquifer relies on rainfall infiltration as the main source of recharge. Due to the dry conditions in the 2023/24 hydrological year, groundwater levels declined to reach restriction level at the Pipitea Wetland well in late January (see Figure 15 below). The April rainfall event provided sufficient rainfall infiltration to increase the water level above restriction level. A lack of rainfall in May means the water level was still within the lower quartile at the end of the month.

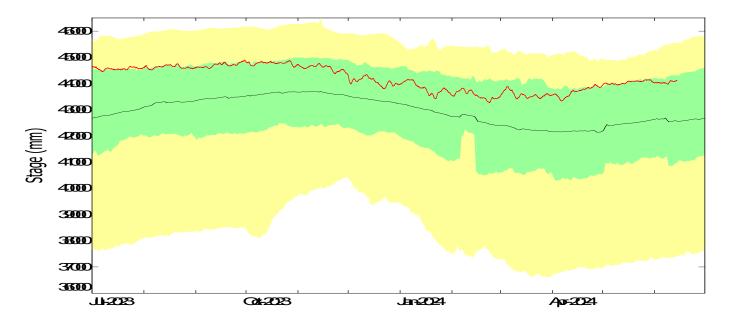


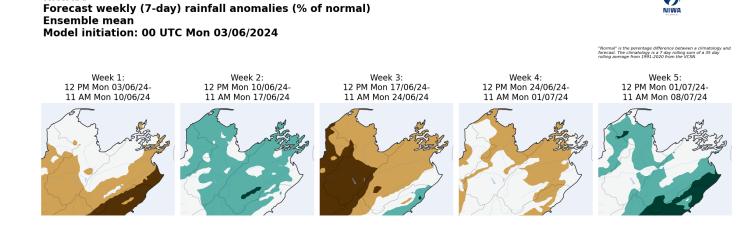
Figure 16. Brancott Aquifer at Brancott Vineyard well 1323 water level, from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. The black line is average groundwater level, and the red line is the 2023/24 groundwater level. The green section is the middle 50% of data and the yellow sections show the upper and lower quartile

Figure 16 below shows the groundwater level in the Brancott Aquifer, which is representative of the Southern Valley aquifer systems. Since the Southern Valleys Irrigation Scheme (SVIS) was established in 2004, pumping from the Southern Valleys aquifers has been minimal. Groundwater levels in the aquifer are therefore relatively high and stable throughout the year.

## **Climate Outlook June to August 2024**

NIWA35

Very Dry

Autumn was an unusually cold season, with frequent southerly winds. More westerly winds are expected over winter, meaning winter temperatures should not be as unusually cold as those experienced in autumn. Air pressure is expected to be higher than normal near New Zealand, so rainfall events may be irregular. The second week of June should bring decent rain to the northern South Island. This can be seen in Figure 17 below, which shows the weekly rainfall anomalies for the Top of the South Island over the next 5 weeks. Rainfall over winter as a whole is expected to be near or below average in Marlborough.

After the drought hindered fencing and planting for the final quarter of last year and first quarter of this year, rain in this quarter has allowed all planned planting and fencing projects to proceed.

Challenges this year have included the drought, which delayed both fencing and planting and meant that in some instances landowners no longer had capacity to do planned work due to increased financial constraints. The government change and subsequent uncertainty around key regulations such as Stock Exclusion Regulations and Fresh Water Farm Plans has also posed challenges, with some work being delayed as landowners wait to see what the changes might be and what impact this will have. This, coupled with the drought and a financially challenging year for many farmers, means that some may deprioritise riparian fencing and planting at this stage. This has potential implications both for the project and for the continued improvement of water quality in Marlborough.

This year saw a 100% increase in the number of landowners involved in fencing or planting projects through the Catchment Care programme compared to last year. Having new landowners engage in the project has been a highlight of this past project year. Plants established and area planted has already exceeded the project targets and seeing the progress of previous plantings despite the challenging conditions of the last year, has been a positive too.

## **Hill Country Erosion Fund**

(E355-019-004)

The Hill Country Erosion Fund (HCEF) is jointly funded by the Ministry of Primary Industries (MPI) and Marlborough District Council. The fund provides assistance, advice and funding for landowners to treat eroding or erosion prone land.

The HCE Programme supports the council to:

- work with landowners in mapping and identifying erosion-prone land
- deliver catchment initiatives and sustainable land management projects
- build their technical capacity to deliver erosion-control work

It also supports and treats erosion-prone land, usually with trees as the main treatment, through:

- space planting of trees (far enough apart that pasture can grow between them for grazing stock)
- land retirement and reversion to native vegetative cover
- forestry

The programme is funded in four yearly cycles. At the end of this financial year, the fund has successfully delivered on its first year of the second round. Considering the conditions over the dry summer period, the majority of plantings from 2023 have survived well.

#### Forecast for 2024/2025

This year's drought and poor prices in the sheep and beef sector have had a major impact on farmers who have reduced expenditure. As a result, pole orders have been slow for the coming season, however 2000 poplar or willow poles are planned for planting this winter so far. Landowners considering native plantings in retired areas are going well, with approximately 30,000 seedlings planned to go in for 2024 winter/spring.

## **Building Control Group**

## Building Control - Building Consent Authority (BCA) & Territorial Authority (TA) Activity to 31 May 2024.

The building department remains busy with a range of legislation requirements its tasked to undertake. Activities across the group's functions as a Building Consent Authority (BCA) and Territorial Authority (TA) continues to be slow in comparison with last year and the five-year average. Despite the national slowdown in the building industry the changes to building codes, increased surveillance by BCA auditors, and departure and some large commercial projects have put considerable demand on staff resources.

Over the last two months, the overall number of applications for Building Consents received by the building consent authority has slightly increased compared to the first quarter of 2024. However, overall building consents received in April-May 2024 is down by 10% compared to April-May 2023. There drop in the residential building consent numbers also continued over the last two months with Marlborough seeing 56% drop of new dwelling building consents received compared to same period of April-May of the last year.

The overall sector slowdown was as forecasted and will come as no surprise to most. The downturn in new residential building construction is deepening and we're expecting a sizeable downturn in overall building activity over 2024, with many of those we've spoken to in the building industry reporting a sharp drop in forward orders from customers. However, at least for now the extent of any softening has been moderated by the pipeline of projects which were consented over the past few years. It is expected that the residential building consent market will remain very tight for the next quarter months or more so for next 7-8 months. Without questions, the first half of 2024 has been a tough year for whole construction sector, right across New Zealand.

#### **IANZ Accreditation**

Marlborough District Council Building Consent Authority (BCA) completed its bi-annual BCA accreditation audit undertaken by International Accreditation New Zealand (IANZ) between 13th and 17th May 2024. Only accredited Building Consent Authorities are permitted to perform building consenting and certifying functions in terms of the Building Act 2004. This assessment is the tool to determine that the BCA is meeting its requirements under the Accreditation Regulations, which requires us to have a robust Quality Assurance Manual and meet the legal requirements to accept, process, issue and certify Building Consents. It provides specific requirements for employees to have appropriate qualifications and competencies, identifies staff training requirements and all other requirements are around equipment, systems and resourcing numbers.

The BCA's risk, both to the Territorial Authority, as a BCA and also as an organisation accredited by IANZ was assessed at this audit. The BCA was considered to pose a Low Risk and thus will remain at bi-annual monitoring timeframe.

The IANZ assessment team were very impressed with the way BCA operated as a whole team and how passionate building control team was to deliver good customer service. The assessment team noted that BCA had demonstrated consistent engagement with the accreditation process and were enthusiastic towards continuous improvement, with the BCA making good use of the available discussion time during audit. Building control staff were all consistently friendly and helpful and communication with the assessment team was handled professionally.

The initial assessment report received from IANZ also identified that Marlborough District Council had a motivated team who had been well prepared for the assessment, to ensure that the time on site was able to be used effectively. While on site, there were a number of areas which stood out to the assessment team. Firstly, training information was seen to be particularly well laid out, with appropriate planning and consistently good recording of information across sighted examples. They were also particularly impressed by the BCA's whole operation process of vetting applications, processing consents, issuing of building consents, specified system recordings, compliance schedules process, contractor performance reviews, duty enquiries, dams processing and made some incredibly positive comments about these operations multiple times during the audit. They quoted that "there are not many BCAs in the country that the assessment team can say those many good things about, so the BCA team should be proud of themselves".

The BCA only received 5 General non-compliances (GNC), 14 Recommendations and 2 advisory notes during the bi-annual audit. This is an improved performance from the last audit undertaken in May 2022 for BCA where there were 7 General non-compliances (GNC), 15 Recommendations and 3 advisory notes. Following the audit the BCA provided their action plan to IANZ to address the GNC findings which has now been accepted by assessment team on 19 June 2024. The BCA must clear all identified general non-compliances by 30th August 2024 and further updates will be provided to the committee in due course.

### **Changes to the BCA Accreditation Regulations**

On 17 June 2024 the coalition government cabinet approved the changes to the Building (Accreditation of Building Consent Authorities) Regulations 2006. The changes include:

- Regulation 6A -The requirement for BCAs to notify MBIE and IANZ of a change to their Quality Assurance Manager.
- Regulation 10(2) A reduction in the frequency of competency assessments for building control
  officers from annually to at least once every two years.
- Regulation 7(2)(f) Separating the compliance provisions in 7(2)(f) to improve the clarity of assessment results
- Regulation 19 and Schedule 2 Changes to the accreditation fees to ensure IANZ recover the cost
  of delivering the BCA accreditation assessment programme.

IANZ charges building consent authorities a fee-for-service for accreditation assessments. The proposed fees increase will takes effect from 17 June 2024, and will again be reviewed again in accordance with the timeframes set out in the Treasury Guidelines for setting fees (i.e. every three to five years).

Building Control Group over the next year will have to review and assess the impacts of the proposed fee increase on group's operational costs and budgets. The initial assessment identifies that the potential increased accreditation costs for building consent authorities could range from \$15,000-\$30,000 depending on the results of the IANZ assessment for building consent authority. It is envisaged that the potential increased accreditation costs for building consent authorities would need to be reflected in the building consent fees or by introduction of BCA Accreditation levy for all building consent applications into the building control group fee and charges policy. This process will be dealt through a separate discussion document in near future.

#### **Changes to Building Levy**

The building levy supports investment in and development of the building sector. The revenue from the levy is used to fund a range of the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) functions and activities under the Building Act 2004 that monitor, oversee and improve the building sector. It is payable by building owners or developers on successful building consent applications for projects that are worth more than a prescribed threshold. It is collected through the building consent application process administered by building consent authorities.

On 25 March 2024, new regulations were passed to change the prescribed building levy threshold. From the 1st of July 2024, the minimum estimated value of building work, usually referred to as the building levy threshold, is increasing from \$20,444 to \$65,000 (including GST) for building consents. The building levy rate remains at \$1.75 per \$1,000 and part \$1,000.

### **Dam Safety Statistics**

Building (Dam Safety) Regulations 2022 have now come into force on 13th May 2024. The regulations will provide a consistent, nationwide framework by setting out minimum safety standards for dams in New Zealand. Building Control group has worked extremely hard over the last 18 months to get its processes and systems in place to be able to administer the regulations. These regulations require classifiable dam owners to submit a Form 1: Dam classification certificate to their regional authority by 13 August 2024 for dams commissioned before 13 May 2024, and for dams commissioned on or after 13 May 2024, dam owners must provide a Form 1 within 3 months of the dam being commissioned.

The Minister for Building and Construction has identified that Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) and regional authorities (RA) have an important role to play in continuing to monitor the implementation and measuring the success of these regulations. MBIE has now as a result requested that BCA provide ongoing regular access to its Dam Safety monitoring data under Section 204 of the Building Act 2004. MBIE will use the collected data to help inform implementation activities and measure the success of the regulations and regional authority's performance of functions under the Building Act. MBIE request the Dam Safety regulations information on a quarterly basis from RA. The ongoing monthly and quarterly request for this data includes provision of following information:

- The number of Form 1: Dam classification certificate received.
- The number of Form 2: Dam safety assurance programme received.

A summary of the data will be shared with the Minister of Building and Construction, Dam Safety Technical Working Group, which is made up of industry experts, and also with the Dam Safety Regional Authority Steering Group.

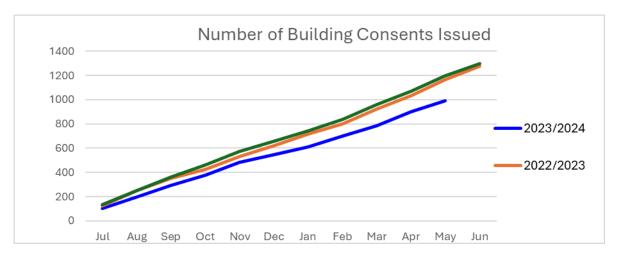

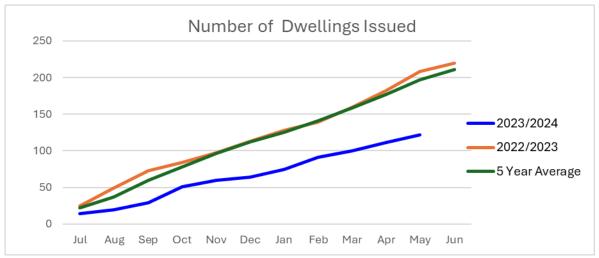

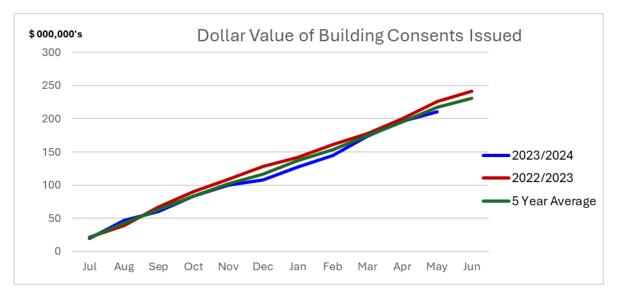

Pool compliance team for Territorial Authority is on target in the first five months of the year to complete the minimum number of swimming pool inspections it is required to undertake for the year. The number of swimming pool inspections failed is significantly high compared to the inspections that were passed. The common items associated with failure of these inspections is general lack of maintenance of swimming pool fences where either the gates are not self-closing or not self-latching. Several failures are also associated with properties not having a backflow prevention device installed to protect water supply within their own properties. There are also swimming pools which have failed inspections after their expiry of Pool covers. This high number of swimming pool inspections fails puts additional pressure on staffing resources in this area given the high numbers of multiple follow up inspections that are required to be undertaken to resolve the issues.

Compliance Investigation team has received less complaints for the first five months of the year compared to the same time period last year, however the complexity of cases and the level of offending has increased for the types of complaints that have been received by the group and this is evident by the number of infringements issued for this period compared to last year.

#### **Earthquake Prone Buildings**

The Government has brought forward a review of the earthquake-prone building system to 2024 to identify improvements in the way Aotearoa/New Zealand manages seismic risk in existing buildings. While the full scope and terms of reference are still in development, it's expected that the review's outcomes will include ensuring a regulatory approach that appropriately balances reducing life safety risk in an earthquake and the impact on building owners and other affected people.

While the review is underway, the Government intends to amend the Building Act 2004 to extend all non-lapsed earthquake-prone building remediation deadlines, as of 2 April 2024, by four years, with an option to extend by a further two years if required.

Earthquake prone building team for TA has completed the previously required staged events under the regulations (to identify known 'At Risk' buildings, issue requests for engineering assessments, review those assessments, make decision on EPB status & issue EPB Notices as appropriate) and is now in a record maintenance period working through to the conclusion period for each cited building with EPB Notices.

There are 54 buildings in Marlborough that are listed on the Ministry of Business and Innovation (MBIE) Earthquake Prone Building register. 17 of those buildings have been strengthened/demolished and will be removed from the register, which currently leaves 37 buildings on EPB register with existing EPB Notices. Only 1 building in the region is outside the statutory timeframe and has expired EPB notice; and ongoing discussion held with property owner to address this building to comply with EPB program. The buildings that remain on the register have between 13-18 years to complete strengthening otherwise they face demolition. So, apart from awaiting further legislative changes by government on EBP scheme, we will continue to monitor the future deadlines of notices expiry for buildings on EPB register.

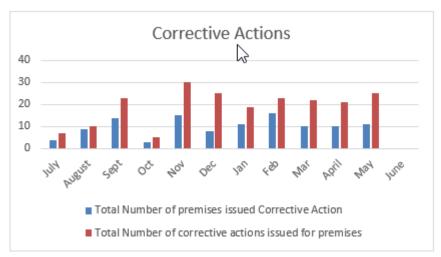

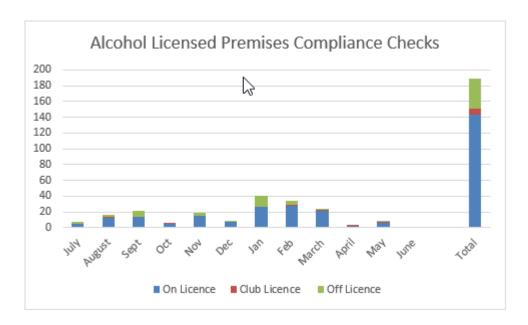
Number of Food Act Verifications completed year to date from 1 July 2023.

Number of complaints received by Environmental Health matters for period of 1 July 2023 to date.

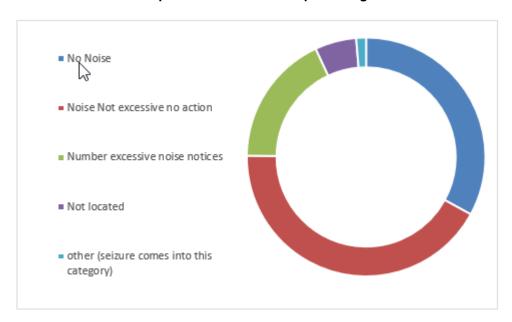

Number of Noise Complaints received 1 July 2023 to date

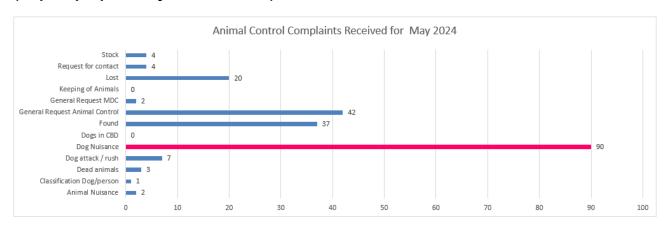


#### Outcomes of noise complaint assessments as percentage

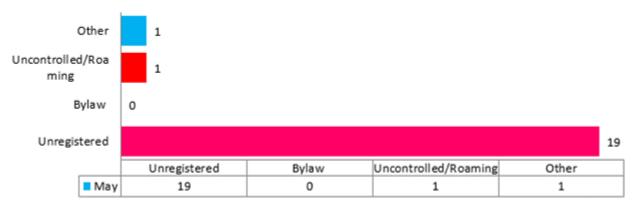

CRMS Received for the period 2019 to 31 May 2024



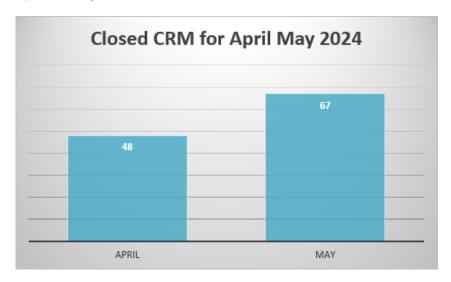
**CRMS Received** for April and May 2024



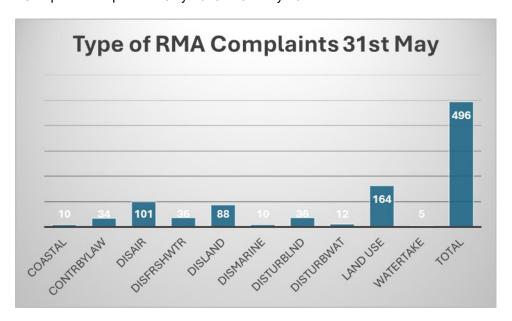
CRMS Closed for the period 2019 to 31 May 2024



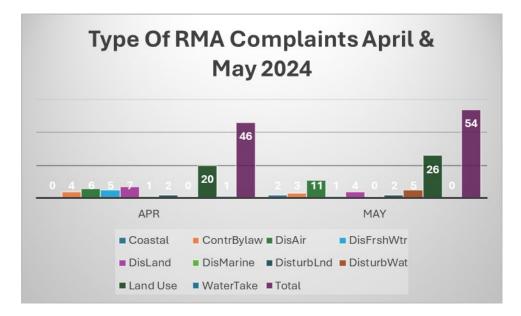

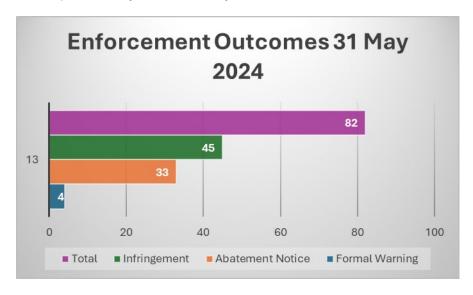
Types of RMA Complaints for period 1 July 2023 to 31 May 2024

Enforcement Outcomes April and May 2024



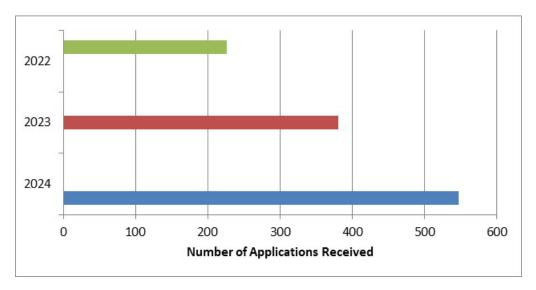

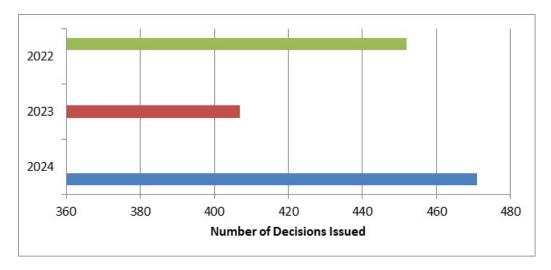

The number of applications being received by the Resource Consent (RC) Team has picked up considerably after a relatively slow start earlier in the year. In the first 24 weeks of the 2024 year the Council received **548** applications which is more than in both 2023 and 2022. Of the total received, **517** were new applications for resource consent. Council also received **27** applications for variations to resource consent conditions under section 127 and **4** applications under section 125 for an extension to lapse date. In the same period in 2023 Council received **381** applications and in 2022 Council received **468** applications.



Over the first 24 weeks of 2024 Council has issued **471** decisions. Of that total, **433** were for new applications for resource consent. Council has also issued **31** section 127 decisions (variations to resource consent conditions) and **7** section 125 decision (extension to lapse date). In the same period in 2023 Council issued **407** decisions and in 2022 Council issued **452** decisions.



Applications in processing were at a **610** at the end of June 2024. This is more than the numbers in processing in 2023 (**530**) and 2022 (**586**).

The RC Team sent out the Winter RC Team newsletter on 1 June 2024. The newsletter had articles on the requirements of section 87BA (DPBA); the duty planner service; a practice update on erosion and sediment control plans; the hidden costs of tiny houses; out of season frost fan use and the number of consents issued by type over the last year. We also introduced the new Senior Legal Counsel, Autumn Faulkner. The RCT newsletter which is always well received by our stake holders is also available on the Council website. Previous issues can also be found on the Council website.
